Mrs. I. D. Fink, Guest Speaker

The 1961 United Jewish Appeal will open officially on Monday evening, April 24th, with a gala dinner. The guest speaker will be Paulette Oppert Fink, dynamic chairman of the National Women's Division of the U.S. United Jewish Appeal.

A brilliant speaker who has addressed audiences throughout the North American continent on behalf of U.J.A., Mrs. Fink did vital and dangerous work in rescuing children from the Nazis in World War II. After the war, she worked with Aliyah Bet, the organization which conducted secret immigration to Palestine. Born and educated in Paris, Mrs. Fink and her first husband, Lt. Yves Oppert of the French Army, both joined the Marquis when the Nazis overran France. Lt. Oppert was captured by the Germans and executed but his wife carried on by establishing J.D.C., supported children's homes where thousands of homeless waifs were sheltered during the occupation.

This is a tragic fact which is brought into sharper focus during the Festival of Freedom.

We must also remember that 488 farm settlements, most of which are located on the borders of Israel, are direly in [need of help so that their populations can be self-sufficient. And let us not forget that twenty-five to thirty thousand new immigrants are still arriving in Israel every year and must be assisted to take their places as dignified and productive citizens.

Here at home, the Talmud Torah, Edmonton's bastion of Jewish education, is also performing a might task in building Jewish lives. The Bible says, "Train up a child in the way he should go. And even when he is old, he will not [depart from it." Our Talmud Torah is most certainly doing [excellent work in imparting our Jewish heritage and the Hebrew language to our children. Rabbi, Congregation Beth Shalom Passover is only the first stage in the search for freedom on the part of our remote bibical ancestors; they did not become free men by escaping from the brickyards of Egypt. Freedom does not come that automatically, nor does it come by fiat nor by running away from our burdens. What they did win was liberation and liberation is not ne-

The rabbinic masters teach us that Pesach and Shabuoth are the two faces on the same coin; one is incomplete without the other. Pesach memorializes the escapt from Egypt; Shabuoth the acceptance of the Law. Oour ancestors achieved freedom, say our sages, only when they embraced the Law and gladly subordinated themselves to its disciplines; then and not till then, did they become free men.

Say our sages: Moses and Aaron gathered the elders of Israel and said unto them "Thus hath the Holy One, blessed be He, spoken: 'I have remembered, remembered you.' " Because Moses and Aaron repeated the word "remembered" the elders saw in them the true leaders and followed them. The first remembrance referred to the external aspect; that is, physical, political, economic liberation; the second referred to inner transformation, to redemption of heart and mind.
