### Tentative Itinerary

Monday, April 27th 1992:

Afternoon departure from Toronto and Montreal aboard El Al Israel Airlines direct flight to Warsaw.





### Purim Faces for all Ages!

On Purim, we dress up in fanciful clothes to hide from the wicked Haman. Anything goes! To make your celebration easier, follow this simple rule: A face can be made up simply and easily to portray a variety of figures. Once the face is made up, the costume becomes very simple.


First a word about make-up. Choose watercolors. They are not harsh on the skin and are relatively inexpensive. They also wash off easily and the range of colors is infinite.

Next, choose a good paintbrush. Take one and hold it by the handle, with the head down and shake it vigorously. If it loses its bristles and your dog sneezes, it means the brush is not very good. Try one with natural bristles instead.

Finally, let your imagination run free. Be what you never thought you could be. When working on the face, always do half the face completely. Start with the half opposite to your handedness, since that is the hardest to do and easiest to match for balance. Keep sponges close by and fresh clean water.

Here are some ideas for funny faces and fanciful costumes:

Outline features in black, then fill in lips and nose with red and eye area with white for an exaggerated look. Put bright strips of color on the cheeks.



Costume: Use a brightly colored (one color) sweatsuit or sleeper type p.j. For collar use five different colored j-cloths cut diagonally in half and baste of pin to collar of sweat-shirt. Ruffle a strip around wrists and legs. Make clown hat from cone shaped party hat decorated with stickers etc.

Cover the whole face with a base of light orange. Apply black and white patches with a flat paintbrush around / /> mouth, cheeks and forehead. Fill in lines with black. To draw whiskers, \ use a fine brush and swift strokes.

Costume: Dress in black or grey sweats. Tie bow-tie or scarf around neck. Glue triangular shape sponges to hair band for ears.

Metallic silver and black make-up gives the robot an eeric glow. Add rivets with eyebrow pencil.

Costume: Baste copper or silver dish scrub balls to collar.

### Phantom

Use dots of blue, green and white blended unevenly with fingertips to create scary monster skin. Add black in the hollows and white on the high points to / make it even more ghoulish.

Costume: Cover hands with clear plastic surgical gloves. Using cheesecloth or gauze to make collar and head



# Paula's Pantry

By Paula Weil

Haman's Ears (makes about 3 dozen)

There are many variations of this deep fried pastry, the most widespread of all Purim dishes.

2 large eggs 2 large egg yolks

1/4 c. sugar

3 Tbsp. oil 2 Tbsp. Brandy or Rum 1 tsp. finely grated lemon zest

1/2 tsp. salt 1/2 tsp. baking powder 2 1/2 c. unbleached flour

1 tsp. vanilla

oil for frying confectioner's sugar

Blend together eggs, egg yolks, sugar, oil, brandy, zest, vanilla and baking powder. Gradually beat in flour, mixing to make a soft dough. On a lightly floured surface, knead until smooth (2-3 minutes) Cover and chill 1/2 hour.

On floured board, roll out dough to 1/16" thickness. With a pastry cutter or knife, cut pastry into strips 1" wide and 4-6" long. Pinch strips in centre and twist. Slowly heat about 2" of oil to about 375° F.

Fry several strips at a time, turning to fry evenly. (about 1 minute) Remove with a slotted spoon and drain on paper towels. Sprinkle generously with confectioners sugar and store at room temperature in an airtight container.

# Postone to present Torah in honour of Haft to Beth Israel

One of the most important occasions in the history of a synagogue will take place on Saturday, April 11, when Rabbi and Mrs. Abraham Postone will present a Torah to Congregation Beth Israel in honour and, in memory of Mrs. Postone's parents, Rabbi and Mrs. Isaac Haft. The presentation will be an integral part of Congregation Beth Israel's 85th Anniversary Celebration.


Rabbi Haft served Congregation Beth Israel from 1932 to 1941. Born in Novgorod, Seversk, Ukraine, Rabbi Haft came to Edmonton in 1934, after having served as rabbi in Winnipeg for one year and in Yorkton for two years.

An only son, Rabbi Haft grew up at a time in Russia's history when Stalin's power prevented religious children from attending school. As Stalin's power became increasingly more oppressive, Rabbi Haft fled his native land to come to

Notwithstanding restrictions placed him as a religious Jewish child, Rabbi Haft became a scholar in many languages and was accorded many honours. Among his honours was an invitation to be present at the government celebrations in honour of King George's coronation. The satin robe he wore for this historic occasion was seen recently in the "Coat of

the Provincial Museum.

Rabbi Haft's sudden death in 1941 at the age of 56 deeply saddened his family and shocked his congregation. He had served Beth Israel with intelligence, dedication and love; his loss was deeply felt. Mrs. Haft, whose home was open to all at all times, passed away three years later.

Later in the year, Rabbi Haft's son-in-law, Rabbi Postone assumed the position of Rabbi for the Beth Israel, and remained in that

position for 28 years.

During his tenure as rabbi, Rabbi Postone followed in his father-in-law's shoes, bringing honour to himself, his family and his congregation. Among his many honours and efforts, Rabbi Postone was a Negev Dinner honource, President of the local chapter of Bar Ilan University, President of the Mizrachi Men's Organization, served on the Board of the Talmud Torah, and organized the Junior Congregation of the Talmud Torah. Knowing that it was essential to involve the energies of the women in the congregation, Rabbi Postone organized the formation of the Sisterhood, known as B'not Israel, Since at that time only a men's organization existed, this was a new and difficult concept for both the men and the women of Beth Israel to conceive. As time and the Sisterhood have proved, Rabbi Postone was truly a man of vision.


His years as rabbi here in Edmonton are remembered with great affection and respect.

Following his tenure in Edmonton, Rabbi Postone moved to Calgary in 1968 where he assumed the position of Associate Rabbi for the Schaarey Tzedek Synagogue until his retirement in 1987. Having been the daughter of a rabbi, Mrs. Postone recently noted, "it wasn't hard to be the wife of a rabbi". Mrs. Postone, too, took her place as an

rebbitzen, Mrs. Postone was a founding member of the Beth Israel Sisterhood and served as its Program

Chairman, and a Life Member in both Mizrachi Women's Organization and Hadassah.

Rabbi and Mrs. Postone have three children and five grandchildren. Moishe lives in Chicago with his wife Margret; Norman resides in San Francisco with his wife, Lisa and their two children, Ariel and Zachary and Marilyn lives in Edmonton with her husband Les Moss, and their three children, Neri, Barbra, and Jessica.

The Torah which the Postones will be presenting to the Beth Israel has its roots in the old world and has been decorated by a new land. While the Torah was brought by Rabbi Pos-

tone from Lithuania where it had belonged to the Postone family and was in use in the synagogue in Vilkovischk, Lithuania, the Torah's wooden handles and mantel are both from Israel.

The inscription on the Torah reads: "In Memory of Rabbi and Mrs. I. Haft, by the Family".

The entire community is invited to attend Shabbat services at the Beth Israel, Saturday morning, April 11, and to join the Postone Family and the congregation for this very special occasion. Kiddush will be served in the social hall following services.
